# Preschool News



#### Academics:

In math, our students will be working on identifying numbers to 100, 3D shapes, and coordinate planes.

In reading, our students will be working on comprehension strategies with both nonfiction and fiction text. We will be working on asking and answering questions like who, what, where, why, as well as looking at how characters change over time.

# **Rams Athletics**

Boys Basketball: This week the boys will finish up their seasons and head to Big Rapids for the league tournament! Great job this year boys and good luck on Saturday!

January 15: The Renaissance "A" team will travel to Big Rapids for a make-up game against St. Peter. This game is scheduled to start at 6:30, and the bus will leave here around 5:15.

January 15: The Renaissance "B" team will be home to play the Panthers of Trinity. This game is scheduled to start at 5:30. Whether you are traveling to Big Rapids or cheering the Rams in our gym, we appreciate your support and know that the student-athletes love having you at their games. Go Rams!

### Tournament:

January 20: All three of our teams will be on the bus to Big Rapids High School. The bus will leave Renaissance at 11:25 AM. The tournament is scheduled to begin at 1:00. As soon as the tournament brackets are released, they will be posted on the athletic website. We are not expecting them to be released until Friday, as games are still being played in the league through the 18th.

Remember, a signed transportation waiver is required for an athlete to be transported by someone other than the bus.

#### **Cheer Team:**

The cheer team will travel to Brandon High School in Ortonville for the competition on February 25. The bus will leave Renaissance at 6:45am, and the competition is scheduled to begin at 9:15am. Teams must arrive early to register.

## Girls Basketball:

The girls basketball tryouts will be held on January 16. When school is dismissed, the girls trying out should change into practice gear and head to the gym. Remember to have your physical form with you to give to the coach (if you've already participated in a sport this school year at Renaissance, we already have a copy on file, and you are all set; otherwise, we need a copy). All other athletic forms and fees are due to the coach prior to the first game being played. Please note: Girls Basketball will begin before Boys Basketball finishes. During this short period, the girls will have to wait until the boys are finished with the gym. We had a similar situation at the end

of the volleyball season, when the boys had to wait for the girls to finish their season.

Additionally: Any members of the girls cheer team that are planning on playing basketball will have to attend both practices until the cheer competition is over at the end of February.

## Schedules:

The coaches are currently working with the athletic department in order to make as smooth a transition as possible between all of the sports and their practice schedules. As soon as things are finalized, they will be released and posted on the website for families.
