Soon, your child will be showcasing their schoolwork and discussing educational goals with you through a new format called Student-Led Conferences. During your scheduled conference time, students will lead the discussion with you about their school work, while the teacher's role will be to support the students as they direct the conversation and answer questions you may have. It is important to schedule your conference at a time when your child can attend with you.

There are several goals for holding conferences using this format:

<u>For parents</u> – it is our hope that families will get to <u>see</u> rather than simply being <u>told</u> about their child's progress

<u>For students</u> – it is our hope that students will take ownership of their learning through reflecting and sharing their progress

<u>For teachers</u> – it is our goal that teachers will have more meaningful and impactful conferences with families and students

<u>For all</u> – it is our hope to maximize our time together, create ways to partner with one another to support student success.

In math, our students are working on Fact Families. Also, we are focusing on addition and subtraction w/ and w/o regrouping.
