

Some are very excited to see the first signs of snow, while others are already dreaming of spring. At RPSA we value not only our time in the classroom but the experiences students have when they are outside and playing with one another. This year we will be making an increased effort to get outside as often as Mother Nature allows. Please help your child plan accordingly so they can enjoy their time outside each day.

Students will go outside when the FEELS LIKE temperature is 10F or above.

Students will NOT go outside when

It is raining or freezing rain.

The actual temperature is 9F or below.

The FEELS LIKE temperature is OF or below.

The FEELS LIKE temperature is between 9F and 1F, recess outside will be determined by the office based on sunshine, wind speed, and precipitation. EVERY EFFORT TO HAVE CHILDREN OUTSIDE FOR RECESS WILL BE MADE.

We use The Weather Channel as our up to the minute source to determine if we go outside.

Students in grades K-4 should come to school every day with all of the necessary clothing to go outside every day. Every student is expected to go outside with their classmates. Required winter clothing for students in grades K-4th includes Hat and Gloves

Coat

Snowpants

Boots

Trailblazers and Middle School students in grades 5-8 may make personal choices for the clothing worn outside during the winter month. A change of shoes/boots will be required to go off the paved area of the playground.

Winter boots MAY NOT be worn in the classroom during the school day. Students MUST change into dry shoes for the classroom.

If your child is in need of any of the necessary clothing items for the winter please contact your child's teacher or stop by the office. We have many resources to assist students with their needs. Don't hesitate to ask!







## **Specials and Enhancements**

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Title: The Lost Pet Art Installation Made by the Students of Renaissance Public School Academy

Each pet advertisement serves as a symbol for all lost pets and their owners. Renaissance students not only learned the importance of getting their message across through effective advertising, but gained empathy for those suffering losses (both animals and humans). In this project, the students explore beyond the concept that art has to be a pretty picture on a wall, but can be used in practical applications that can positively impact the community.

Resources if you have lost your pet:

-Post and share on all social media sites.

-Post on "For the Love of Louie", a Facebook site that has a large network and has saved many

lost pets. -Check Craigslist to see if someone found your pet and is possibly trying to sell it. -Call and visit all vets and animal shelters in the area. There are two shelters in Mt Pleasant, the Humane Animal Treatment Society (989-775-0830), and the Isabella County Animal Shelter (989-773-9721).

-Display fliers in busy places and where the pet was lost. It helps if they are brightly colored. -Put a piece of clothing (for scent) near where the pet was last seen and check it routinely.

### **BATTLE OF THE BOOKS**

We are offering an opportunity for interested fourth and fifth grade students to compete in the Battle of the Books competition sponsored by the Grace A. Dow Library in Midland. This program has been offered for four decades and helps build a sense of teamwork and a love for reading. Third grade students will be offered the opportunity to participate in our school practice battles in preparation for joining an official team next year. Sixth grade students can participate as assistant coaches by reading, offering encouragement, creating sample questions, and helping teams practice for the official battle.

Teams of students will work together to read and understand a list of 20 books. Individual students will need to read and become familiar with approximately four books in order to support their teammates. Copies of the books are available at school for students to check out. You may also check them out from the local library.

There are a series of written and oral battles that will take place in February and March. The top performing teams will advance to future rounds. Interested students should sign up with Mr. Mayer. This is an extracurricular event, so the majority of reading preparation will need to take place outside of school. Weekly team meetings to check in and support students will take place during lunch time.
