Special thanks to all of the students and families who donated nonperishable food and personal care items to our annual food drive. Once sorted, we had over 45 boxes of food and personal care items collected. Those items will be used to fill holiday boxes for families in need at our school and across our community.

SCHOOL CLOSURES AND DELAYS

The determination to delay or cancel school for Renaissance Public School Academy is made based on the recommendations from our surrounding school districts. Our surrounding school district's Superintendents, transportation directors, local road commissions and law enforcement begin to check roads as early as 4:00 am. A decision is made based on current conditions and predicted conditions. Conditions considered include snowfall amounts, visibility (fog or blowing snow), drifted roads, icy roads and temperatures. If the actual temperature is below -25 school will be cancelled. We will consider cancelling at -20 depending on the forecast. Temperature is taken into consideration because of frostbite potential. Safety is always first and foremost.

RPSA families with a current phone number on file will receive a text message each time a delay or cancellation is issued for our school. Families will also receive an email notification if a current email is on file. If you are not receiving text and email updates from school please stop by the office to update your phone and email address.

Battle of the Books is underway! Many students have expressed interest in the program and have selected books to begin reading. A permission form will be sent home this week and is included in this newsletter. The form is due Friday, December 15 and will indicate the student's willingness to commit as a team member. Each person on a team will be responsible for reading and knowing 3-5 books so the full team will have at least one expert in each of the 20 titles.

Teams will be formed on December 19 and 20. We will form teams in part based on books being read so that there will be equal representation of each title. We will honor student requests to be on teams together as best we can.

We need additional volunteers to serve as team coaches and others to help write practice questions.

Battle of the Books 2017-2018 Participant Commitment Form

Renaissance Academy fourth and fifth-grade students will have the opportunity to participate in a Battle of the Books reading competition. Students will read at least 3 to 4 books from the official list of 20 books selected by the librarians at the Grace A. Dow Library in Midland. Multiple copies of each book are available at school for students to check out. Each team is composed of 6-8 students, and they will compete against teams from other schools in a series of written and oral battles. The highest scoring teams from each round will advance to the next round. We will arrange student transportation via school bus for each battle. Spectators are not allowed to view the written and oral battles and will wait in a designated area for the battle to be completed. School practice battles will take place during lunch time. Third-grade students will be able to read and participate in school practice battles in preparation to participate on the formal team next school year. Sixth-grade students are able to read, help generate questions, participate in school practice battles and collaborate with teams as assistant coaches. Unfortunately, third and sixth-grade students are not eligible for the official battles this school year and do not need a permission form completed.















The Hour of Code!
