Dear Renaissance Families,

As you are all aware we have had 17 weather related school cancellations already this school year. The state of Michigan allows schools six days for weather related cancellations. In addition we have been granted three more forgiveness days by the state. Our School Board took action this winter to change three of our professional development days into student school days. In all we have been able to account for 12 of our 17 days. As a result we must still make up five more student days this school year. Assuming we do not have any other weather related closures and that the legislature does not take any further action statewide we have adjusted our end of year calendar as follows:

- Friday, April 19th will now be a full student day. This adjusts our total make up days to four.
- Our last day of school will be Thursday, June 20. We will add the remaining four make up days Monday, June 17 through Thursday, June 20.
- If the legislature acts to forgive additional days we will move the last day up accordingly. If we
  have additional weather cancellations we will need to move the last day to Friday, June 21 and
  into the week of June 24 if necessary.

We realize this winter created tremendous challenges for families. We also realize it will continue to present challenges as families work to make summer plans. If adjustments are necessary throughout the spring we will update families as soon as possible.

We have also begun planning the 2019-20 school year calendar. It will be discussed at the School Board meeting this evening, Monday, April 1. The proposal for next school year has the first day of school on Monday, August 26th and concludes the school year the second week of June, 2020. A full calendar will be shared with families once it is adopted by the School Board. Look for that to come home through SeeSaw, Facebook and on our school website.

Our staff is already planning an array of enriching learning activities to ensure every school day until the end of the school year is valuable and exciting. Attendance through the end of the school year is essential to ensure we capture a full year of learning and growth for every child.





## Water Day Art:



Renaissance Academy's art installations at Water Day made quite the splash! Thank you to all who dropped off their used water bottles at the art room these past several weeks. And thank you to those who dove right in and helped in the process of creation. The first art installation we created out of the bottles was a giant chandelier that hung from the banisters at the event center. This 14ft netting had roughly 500 plastic water bottles that each student at Renaissance wrote or drew a wish they have for the water on one, then cut it into a spiral, and attached it to the netting. This art installation is a message to say plastic water bottles are causing harm to our water sources and environment. The Trailblazers made another art installation called Messages in a Bottle. Students were given the prompt: If the river had a message to say to humans, what would it say? Students responded to that prompt by creating a paintings, drawings, poems, that displayed what the river's message would be. We created a massive water bottle out of water bottles to hang the artwork inside. The purpose of this project is to encourage our community to reflect on what the river would say to them.

Mr. McCausey's classes will be assessing on Probability this week and beginning Geometry soon.
