



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



Middle School Credit Recovery Summer School

Middle School students who have not successfully completed all of the required work for promotion to the next grade will be required to attend Credit Recovery Summer School until such work is successfully completed. Students who are being considered for Summer School will get a more detailed letter home.

All work must be successfully completed on or before Friday, June 29th to be considered for promotion to the next grade level for the 2018-19 school year. Students who do not attend or who do not complete all of their required work may be retained in their current grade level.

Credit Recovery Summer School dates will run each day from 9:00-12:00 -

Tuesday, June 12 Wednesday, June 13 Thursday, June 14 Tuesday, June 19 Wednesday, June 20 Thursday, June 21

Students must report by 9:00 and remain until 12:00 each session. Students should not be signed out early. Transportation must be available promptly at 12:00. A light snack will be provided each day. Students may bring a water bottle or sports drink but not soda pop or other food.

Students who are disruptive or do not use the Credit Recovery Summer School opportunity appropriately will be removed from the program. Students removed from Summer School will still be required to complete all necessary work by June 29 to ensure they are promoted.

Students who complete all necessary work prior to June 8th will be removed from the Credit Recovery Summer School list. Work completed after June 8th can only be submitted during a scheduled Summer School session. It will not be accepted at the office.

Questions regarding late, missing or incomplete assignments must be directed to the student's advisory teacher. Please contact advisory teachers via email if you have further questions.

GOTR 5K Celebration!

The GOTR 5K Celebration is the culminating experience of the Girls on the Run 10-week program that inspires girls to be joyful, healthy and confident. All season long girls have been working as a team to train for a 5K event while learning lessons that positively impact their competence, confidence, character, connection, and compassion. Our 5K Celebration events are non-competitive, family friendly and open to the community.

Girls on the Run of Central Michigan is hosting its events this season and intends to rotate where the 5K event(s) are held so that all of our communities have the opportunity to host and show their support of GOTR. Hosting our 5K Celebration events allows the focus to be all on our girls and their teams, mitigates multiple safety issues presented by joining an external event, and creates an atmosphere for our girls to be supported and to connect with other teams from the season.

Renaissance Academy will participate in the North Region 5K Celebration on Saturday, May 19 at Harrison High School Stadium. Arrival begins at 9 a.m. and the 5K starts promptly at 10 a.m. Upon arrival, girls will check-in with their coaches and team. From 9-9:50 AM teams will have time to participate in pre-5K activities such as: happy hair, warm-up games, team photos, and more. Parking is available at the stadium. Current Girls on the Run participants do not need to be registered. 5K participation is included with program registration.
