


Renaissance Report

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A Note from Mrs. Bergman:

On behalf of the students, staff and families of RPSA, we want to express our sincere appreciation to the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe for awarding our school \$41,147.50 in grants today. For the first time, two of the grants were awarded to student projects. Ryan Yost and Taylor Parker received \$1,895 to cover the costs of the 75 gallon, freshwater fish tank they created and now maintain in our Open Space. Ruth Lehr was awarded \$1,390 for the supplies necessary to build acoustic panels to acoustically treat our school cafeteria which, when installed, will result in the reduction of the decibel level by 50% during lunches. Two other grants were awarded to our school to support school-wide math and reading initiatives for next school year.

Music Composition Showcase and Band Information for Current 4th grade Students


Schedule:

RPSA Summer: Training Schedule:

June 9-July 1

Run 3-4 days per week, 15-20 minute runs - you should build up to a point where you can run the entire time comfortably without stopping. Cross train (swim, bike, etc.) on off days.

July 2-July 22

Run 4-5 days per week, 20-25 minute runs. Rest and/or cross train on off days.

July 22-August 1

Run 5 days per week, 25-30 minute runs. Rest and/or cross train on off days.
