## Renaissance Public School Academy Groundbreaking Ceremony

East Side of School Building Friday, June 14, 2019 11:30 a.m.

#### WHAT

A 9,500 square foot addition of four classrooms, restrooms, and a Project Exploration Space the
equivalent size of approximately four classrooms.

The addition is about the size of two of our existing pods.

#### **WHY**

- Our school has reached our authorized, maximum enrollment of 450 students for 2019-20.
- The current building is ideally built for 325 students in traditional classroom settings of desks in rows.
- Project Based Learning requires space for group work and the creation of projects of extended periods of time. We have run out of room to work together, create student driven learning and showcase that learning for others.

#### FAQ

Is RPSA adding more classrooms to increase enrollment?

No. We have grown our enrollment and developed our vision for learning in an environment not suited for Project Based Learning. This new space allows us to realize our vision and mission in a true PBL environment.

Will RPSA be adding staff?

No. We have all of our multi-age teams and support staff in place. This new space will mean staff will have more space to better guide student learning.

What about the parking lot?!?!

The project will include an expansion of our existing parking lot by approximately 20 spaces. Though it does not solve all of our parking challenges, it is a step in the right direction.

#### COSTS

- Costs for the building structure estimated at \$1.2 million dollars are being paid for with a loan from IFF of \$1 million dollars and \$200,000 from the RPSA general fund budget/fund equity.
- \$65,000 grant to purchase furniture and equipment to support a Project Based Learning environment throughout the new and existing classrooms supported by the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe.

8th graders should arrive by 5:30 PM and meet in the Middle School Pod C.


## **Exciting news...FREE BOOKS!**

We have EXCITING news to share! Your child will be receiving an RPSA backpack filled with books this week! These books have been chosen especially for your child. He or she had an opportunity earlier this spring to choose some of the titles they would enjoy reading over the summer. The staff at RPSA would like to send a huge thank you to the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe for this amazing opportunity to provide books for all students. We know that reading only a few books (12-15 books for grades K-2 and 4-6 books for grades 3-8) can dramatically decrease the effects of summer slide!

## What is Summer Slide?

#### What Is It?

"Summer Slide" is the tendency for students to lose some of the achievement gains they made during the school year. Did you know that children in low-income households fall behind an average of 2 months in reading during the summer? Also, summer slide is cumulative, which means these learning losses build up each summer. Imagine what this might mean for students as they move from grade-to-grade!



#### What Can We Do?

Access to books is critical! The public library is an excellent free resource for families to have access to books in a wide range of interests and reading levels, as well as librarians to guide children and families in selecting great books. When children select reading materials themselves and read for enjoyment, they receive the most gains in reading achievement, including better reading comprehension, writing style, vocabulary, spelling, and grammatical development. Also, the longer that this free, voluntary reading is practiced, the more consistent and positive the results.

Children and teens tend to read more when adults in their lives encourage them to read, and also when they see those adults reading often themselves.

Children that feel that reading is fun tend to read more often, so summer programs that help make reading enjoyable and social are most successful.

Reading just 4-6 books in grades 3-8 and 12-15 books in grades K-2 over the summer has the potential to prevent a decline in reading achievement scores from the spring to the fall, so even small steps are very beneficial.


## Innovation & STEM
