Annual Title 1 Fall Parent Meeting October 3rd 7:30-8:00 in the cafeteria


This meeting is for any Renaissance parent wanting to know more about our school, Title 1, and ways to get involved. Drop in anytime between 7:30-8:00am.

Students from the Central Michigan University chapter of the Michigan Science Teachers Association will be here to provide fun science experiments for students and their families. All students and families are invited to attend this event!




A huge thank you to all who helped out and shopped the Scholastic Book Fair last week!
