Now we need to keep following the procedures so everyone is kept safe.

PLEASE KEEP THE FOLLOWING EXPECTATIONS IN MIND THROUGH THE END OF THE SCHOOL YEAR:

- Do not enter the parking lot before 3:15. This includes arriving at 3:13 and parking in the drive. It simply is not allowable and those who arrive early will be required to turn around and return AFTER 3:15.
- Do not enter the parking lot through the exit. We have students using the parking lot for recess throughout the day and their safety is our first priority.
- Adults must remain in the loop and in their cars. Please do not park and get out of your car. Our safety plan does not allow adults to walk up to pick up a student.
- WE NEED ALL CARS TO HAVE THEIR NAME SIGN CLEARLY DISPLAYED AT EVERY PICK
 UP. If you need a new sign, please let your teacher know and one will be printed. When it rains, only those with signs will be able to pick up their children efficiently.

SUMMER LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

A team of RPSA staff are working to put the final touches on summer learning opportunities for RPSA students. We will not be offering a daily RAMS Camp again this year. Instead we will be hosting a summer reading program through the library and keeping the library open all summer. We will also host
