Recently, we distributed over 200 Chromebooks to RPSA families to ensure every child able to connect could do so with their own device. We also distributed more than 420 learning-focused care packages to students. Every day we send countless Seesaw messages, meet each other online, and even talk over the phone. We could not do our jobs without your partnership. The RPSA staff sees parents and guardians as partners through this crisis. Thank you for your efforts to help with logging in, reading and replying to Seesaw messages, coming to school and waiting in lines for technology and care packages. We recognize this is not easy for anyone and we appreciate all you are doing to help us stay connected as a school community.
