Dear RPSA Families,I want to begin by thanking those who completed our annual school improvement survey. Your input is always welcome and this survey yielded some very impactful feedback. From that feedback we have compiled a list of common questions or suggestions and plan to address those ideas in upcoming newsletters.

The concerns over our lack of an art teacher this year was evident in the survey comments from families, staff and students. Upon reviewing the surveys, I instantly realized I needed to share our plans for art moving forward so everyone understands why we do not have an art teacher this year and our hopes to bring back art for future school years.

Last summer when our art teacher relocated, we did not have applicants who we believed were a good fit for our school community. The teacher shortage across our country and the even greater lack of teachers in the arts makes hiring a qualified candidate difficult. Instead we chose to add a different Specials class (Movement Lab) into our rotation to increase physical activity for our students. Special thanks to Mrs. Bartell for stepping into that position.

Just last week we resumed our search for an art teacher to begin working with our students in the fall. Our mission and vision as a school assumes that the arts are an integral part of a student's experience at Renaissance.



Gratiot-Isabella Regional Education Service District Millage Election

March 10, 2020

Gratiot-Isabella Regional Education Service District (GIRESD) is seeking the approval of a Headlee Restoration Millage at the March 10, 2020 election. The restoration millage will only affect the Special Education tax levy.

GIRESD was authorized by taxpayers to levy 4.2000 mills but that amount has been rolled back over the years to the current rate of 4.0345 mills due to Headlee.

Headlee is a Michigan law that limits the growth in a tax levy to the rate of inflation. If the levy grows by more than the rate of inflation in a given year, the millage rate is permanently rolled back to limit the growth to the rate of inflation. In those years when the levy grows by less than the rate of inflation, the rate is not adjusted back up to the authorized millage (hence, permanently reduced). Therefore, the GIRESD Board of Education has approved an election to restore the .1655 mills (4.200 – 4.0345) that was reduced due to Headlee roll backs.

To understand the cost to the individual homeowner, please refer to the following chart:

Home/Property Value	Taxable Value	Annual Increase in Tax
\$ 50,000	\$25,000	\$ 4.14
\$ 75,000	\$37,500	\$ 6.21
\$100,000	\$50,000	\$ 8.28
\$125,000	\$62,500	\$10.34
\$150,000	\$75,000	\$12.41

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As you are likely aware, a new strain of coronavirus called SARS-CoV-2 has been causing more and more cases of an illness referred to as COVID-19 in many places of the world. For most, it is like a common cold; however, some have been much sicker and a small percentage have died. So far, no cases have occurred in Michigan, but we are preparing and watching the situation very closely. Your school district is working closely with us at the local health department, as well as the state health department, their local Regional Education Service District/Intermediate School District, and the Michigan Department of Education to be prepared in case this situation worsens.

At this time, the risk of COVID-19 to the general public in Michigan is very low. It is still important to practice everyday illness prevention to help us all stay healthy.

The everyday prevention recommendations are:

- · Stay at home when you are sick.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth, especially with unwashed hands.
- · Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
 - Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
 - Use your sleeve or inner elbow if a tissue isn't available.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a household disinfectant spray or wipe, or a mixture of 2 Tbs. bleach in a gallon of water.

Washing hands often and covering coughs and sneezes can help prevent the spread of illness. Please encourage your children and family members to practice these habits as they truly are important.
