Practicing Fluency with your child....

Reading with fluency means you read accurately with expression and understand what you read. The goal is to sound smooth and natural.

Steps for fluency:

Step 1: Accuracy

- One way to become a fluent reader is to know all the words you are reading. You can do this with *repeated reading*.

First Read	Second Read	Third Read
First Read: As you read the text for the first time, record the words that are hard to read or understand. Get some help learning to read them and practice them.	Read your text a second time. Was it easier? Were you smoother this time? Write any words that are still giving you trouble and practice them.	Read your text a third time, then tell what your text is about. Remember that fluency is important, but it is also important to understand and remember what you read.



Accuracy
I read the words correctly.

Step 2: Rate

- Another way to become a fluent reader is to read at the right pace (not too fast and not too slow). You can do this with *choral reading*. You'll need a reading partner for choral reading. Choose a partner who reads at a good rate. Match your voice to your partner's and keep the same pace.



Rate:
I read at a good rate. Not too fast and not too slow.

Step 3: Expression

- You can also improve your fluency by working on your expression when you are reading. You can do this with *echo reading*. Get a partner who is good at reading with expression, someone who can sound like the characters, then echo your partner's reading.



Expression:
I changed my voice to show feeling
or to sound like the character.

Step 4: Audience

- You can also improve your fluency by reading for an audience. When you read for an audience, pay attention to the punctuation so your audience can understand you. Who will listen to you read? Will you call a grandparent, and aunt or an uncle? Do you have a dog or cat who is a good listener?



Punctuation:
I stopped at periods and paused at
commas.
