Making Connections

When something in a book makes you connect to something in your mind you are making connections.

An example of what this might sound like:

• "In the text it says _____. This reminds me of _____. This helps me to understand the story because _____.



Text-to-self Connection: This reminds me of something I did or saw.



Text-to-text Connection: This reminds me of another book because...



Text-to-world Connection: This reminds me of something that is happening in the world.

Questions to help your kids make connections:

Text-to-self connections

- What are your feelings about what you read?
- How is the text like or not like your own life? Explain.
- In what ways are you like any of the characters? Explain.
- Does the character or topic remind you of your friends or family?
- What character in the text would you like to be? Why?

Text-to-text connections

- How does the text remind you of other things you have read?
- Discuss other works from the same genre.
- Compare what you are reading to other works by the same author.
- Does the author's craft remind you of anything you have read before?

Text-to-world connections

- Compare your text to a current or past event.
- Connect the text to something in your culture or the culture of someone else.
- Does the text make you think of a famous person, place or thing? Explain.
