Multiage Class Configurations for 2022-23

Beginning next year, we are adjusting our multiage practices on our Voyager and Islander teams to allow for a stronger development of foundational literacy and numeracy skills that can later be applied during integrated Project-Based Learning units. First through fourth grade students will receive reading and math instruction in a single grade configuration, and they will have opportunities for multiage collaboration during science and social studies PBL content exploration.
