ALICE/School Safety FAQ We were so appreciative of the families who were able to attend our ALICE

We were so appreciative of the families who were able to attend our ALICE Informational Meeting this week. For those who could not attend, we wanted to share answers to a few of the questions we've received. If you have any additional questions or concerns, please reach out to Mrs. Nix.

How are emergencies communicated to students?	All RPSA Staff have the Rave Panic Button app and will use it in the case of emergencies. Students will receive directions from their teacher following the alert. We will also continue to make announcements over the PA.
What is the Rave app?	Sheriff Main shared at our informational meeting about a new emergency alert tool available in Isabella County. Visit www.isabellacounty.org to learn more about Rave Facility.
How will ALICE be taught to students?	We will share with students that all RPSA staff have been trained in something called ALICE. Students will learn that ALICE includes alert of an emergency, lockdown and barricading the door, and sometimes evacuation. Our messaging to students will be that in an emergency their teacher knows what to do and they should follow their lead. That might mean staying quiet in a part of the classroom, or it might mean leaving the building and going to a safe place. We will have conversations with students about the importance of listening to their teacher in an emergency. Some classrooms may read all or part of the book "I'm not scared, I'm preparedI know ALICE" to help guide these conversations with younger students.
What about this is new for RPSA this year?	Our staff have been trained in ALICE procedures over the last two years, and we work to update and review our school safety plans yearly. None of these pieces have changed. What is new this year is that when we practice a lockdown drill, we will be talking with students about some additional steps they may see their teacher take including barricading the door and practicing leaving the building together.
Will students be asked to "counter" an attacker?	No, students will not be asked to counter an attacker. Our staff have been trained in ways to slow or stop an attack if an attacker were to enter the classroom. We will not be teaching or asking students to practice this concept, but we as a staff are trained and know this should be considered in an emergency.
How will parents know when conversations and drills take place?	We are not able to communicate when safety drills will take place ahead of time, however teachers will message parents following a drill to let you know that we did practice at school that day so you are able to have follow up conversations at home. Teachers will communicate with parents via Seesaw as conversations take place in the classroom.
Is law enforcement going to help with drills?	Yes, law enforcement is always on site for safety drills. During a lockdown, only uniformed officers unlock classroom doors.
