## RPSA Handbook Dress Code Information

### All Renaissance students must adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. Students may wear jeans, slacks, athletic pants, shorts or skirts.
- 2. Shorts and skirts must be longer than the student's fingertips.

The following clothing will be considered inappropriate during the school day:

- 1. Pajama pants
- 2. Halter tops with thin (spaghetti) straps
- 3. Pants with wording across the backside
- 4. Any clothing that reveals a midriff, low-cut neckline, or displays a deep underarm
- 5. Hats and hoods may not be worn in the building
- 6. Any clothing that disrupts or distracts from the learning environment
- 7. Any clothing that is deemed indecent, inappropriate, or dangerous by school staff
- 8. Jackets and coats may not be worn in the classroom during the school day.

Violations of the dress code will result in a guardian being called to provide a change of clothing. The Academy recognizes the importance of individually-held religious beliefs. The Academy will try to reasonably accommodate students' sincerely-held religious beliefs that are in conflict with this Dress Code Policy unless the reasonable accommodation would be detrimental to the educational process or cause any issues to the safety or welfare of others. Students requesting such reasonable accommodations should contact the School Leader.

Families in need of assistance to provide appropriate clothing in accordance with the dress code should contact the school office. Every effort will be made to provide students with appropriate clothing.


#### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEYS

We would like to thank everyone who took the time to share their thoughts through our school improvements surveys several weeks ago. We were encouraged to see that 94% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that they would recommend our school to other families. We are eager to push that result even closer to 100% next year!

Our staff spent several Wednesday Professional Development meetings reviewing the surveys together and thinking through how we might best respond to the thoughts that were shared. The area rated the lowest by parents was learning from the school strategies on how they could best support their students at home. Some of the written comments shared in the survey, and some comments shared individually by parents to staff members, have indicated a desire for more time during Student-Led Conferences (SLCs) for teachers and parents to talk directly about student's academic progress.

Parents have opportunities to learn how to help their children be successful in school.

We made adjustments to next year's school calendar in response to this information. We moved up the fall and spring SLC dates by a couple of weeks to be able to connect with families sooner. We also plan to adjust the format of our conference. We will still ask students to be present to share information about their learning and the goals they have set or the goal progress they have made. We will save time for teachers to share their assessment of student progress, offer suggestions for specific steps parents can take to assist their child, and respond to questions parents may have. Parents will be given the option of asking their student to step out of the room for this part of the conversation, if they so choose. We would also like to remind parents that they may reach out to their child's teacher through Seesaw at any time to get an update on how their child is developing academically or socially.

August 7 will be our designated date for students and parents to meet their classroom teacher for next year. This will be an opportunity to learn about your new class, get a preview of upcoming learning topics for the year, and to share any information that you feel is important for your child's teacher to know. More details will be shared with families during the first week of August.

## Pandemic B T

Important information for parents or guardians of student's eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch at Renaissance Public School Academy.

#### What is the Pandemic-EBT Program?

The Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program provides food benefits to families with children who were not able to get free or reduced-price school meals due to COVID. You may hear about this benefit from other schools or in the media.

#### Who is eligible?

Being eligible for this program will depend on what school your student attends. Eligibility for the Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) Program can be different between schools within the same district.

#### What makes a school eligible for P-EBT?

A school building is eligible only if the building has had 5 school days in a row of reduced in-person hours due to COVID (closures due to staffing shortages do not count for P-FBT benefits).

#### What could make my child eligible for P-EBT?

- 1) If the school they attend is eligible for P-EBT and
- If your student has applied and been approved for free/reduced lunch and
- 3) Did not receive instruction in-person for some or all the month due to COVID-19 related absence
  There

may be months when your student's attendance was different from what the school reported. In that case, you may be able to have your student's benefit level reconsidered. Your request to be reconsidered must be submitted by June 30, 2023. In the month(s) below your school reported primarily in-person. Your student(s) may be P-EBT eligible if your student Did not receive instruction in-person for some or all the month due to COVID-19 related absence in the following month(s):

Sewtember 2022, October 2022, November 2022, December 2023, January 2023, February 2023 March 2023, and April 2023
