

You could make a windmill out of cardboard or a chemical reaction car!

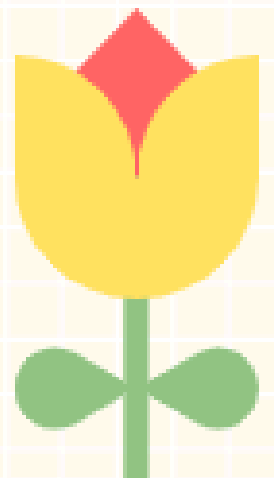
